A note from the Headmaster

November is struggling to decide what it wants to be: Arctic blasts at the start of the week and pleasant autumnal sunshine towards the end. I'm grateful to the many parents (and children!) who looked upon me with sympathy as I shivered on gate duty on Monday morning...your greetings gave me a degree of warmth! We have just concluded our Voice of Student surveys for pupils in Year 3 and above. This is an important chance to hear from your children about how they regard school life. Although the analysis is only just starting, there are many delightful indicators about enjoyment of school, having teachers that care and helping to develop an attitude of respect and tolerance. Our figures relative to other Cognita schools are really pleasing, reflecting the lovely community that exists and the strong relationships between pupils and staff.

One area of the survey questioning that is really important relates to bullying, and this is apposite given we are reaching the end of the national Anti-bullying week. Allegations of bullying arise in the workplace, as the Scottish Labour Party discovered mid-week, and even schools with a strong family-feel can have upsets: children will make mistakes on occasion. It is important that we work with them under these circumstances, so we can help them to make amends for any wrongs they have done and learn the behaviour that is necessary for proper social engagement in later life.

I am committed to the principle that when bullying (or any form of unpleasant behaviour) occurs, we will address it rapidly and make sure it does not continue subsequently. The best way to do this is to ensure the form tutor is informed as soon as a concern arises, so we can deal with the situation fully. Children should feel happy about being in this school, and I am determined that we will achieve this through maintaining the supportive, kind and respectful environment that is so obvious here.
