Similarly, I think it is worth flagging up some other great news from this last week regarding academic progress in the Prep School. Years 1 to 6 undertook GL Assessments after halfterm - a national testing system that enables comparisons with pupils across the country as well as progress being made year on year by the cohort. The scores being secured by each class have indicated a significant improvement for the group compared to last year's scores, showing evidence of progress above and beyond what is happening elsewhere. This is a credit to the staff who work hard to help each child in their learning journey, as well as the home-school partnership which supports their development. I am very proud of what the Prep School teachers have achieved with this year's input. I can appreciate that with the demise of the old "levels", it is harder for parents to be reassured of the steps being made by their child during the course of the year. However, these results are a clear indication of the excellence of provision in the classroom, day after day.
