Pupils achieving the expected standard or above:

Maths - 100%

Reading - 97%

Spelling, Punctuation & Grammar (SPaG) - 94%

These results are fantastic; with scores significantly improved across all areas from last year. Our pupils have performed higher than scores nationally too: in reading, 75% of children nationally achieved the standard, while 76% met the standard nationally in Maths and 78% of pupils met the expected standard in SPaG.

A huge well done to Year 6 who also put on an amazing performance of 'The Next Big Step' on Monday afternoon. All pupils acted with confidence and great character. The quality of the performance was a testament to the pupils (and teachers') hard work. Miss Crump and Mrs Kenton are incredibly proud of the year group in all they have achieved this year.




Stagecoach Guinness World Record attempt...
