### A note from the Headmaster...

We have been delighted to welcome four teachers from the Cognita schools in Brazil. They spent several days visiting our classes, and observing the teachers in action. When I asked them what they would take back to Brazil as overriding memories, they spoke of the amazing calm shown by the children in class and assembly, the wonderful manners and confidence exhibited by each child they saw, and of staff who were consistent and supportive in helping every pupil develop. It made me very proud that fellow professionals could see the strengths in what we do. We are hoping for various inter-school projects and activities for the children to be started through these connections. Suffice it to say that several staff are eyeing up the return visit!

The ISI Inspection report has now been released, and I have sent it to you today for your information, as well as it being placed on the website. Whilst an arduous process - scrutinising all that we do in school - it found that we met all the standards required of independent schools, reflecting the focus we place on the children's education and their welfare.

Finally, a plea to the parents of older pupils (although all are welcome to apply the principles). When children are young, various routines are established that ensure bed time is punctually observed and gives the child sufficient time to rest. As they become older, teenagers wrestle with the desire for more independence and for more interaction with social media, games and video sites. Unfortunately, we are seeing some of our oldest pupils struggling with the demands of hard working days at school and late night interactions with technology: times of beyond midnight are being seen for some, so it is little wonder that they are struggling with fatigue, poor health, anxiety and irritability. Please can everyone do the following – and blame it on me. Remove all the devices by 10.30pm, so settling down to reading and sleep can begin. It is well established that FOMO (fear of missing out) keeps teenagers attached to their devices long in to the night, fearful of not seeing the latest comment or meme. If we all remove the devices for the night-time, no child need worry about FOMO, and the rest can

allow them to keep suitably charged for the months
