### A note from the Headmaster

I had a startling realisation yesterday: in terms of time, I am one of the least influential people on my own sons. Looking at a typical week, I might exchange words with them for five minutes over breakfast, share fifteen minutes at dinner time, and then catch up to ten other minutes driving them to the gym or helping with homework. It shouldn't surprise me, given my role at school, but it is evident that the people who secure the most time influence with my children are their fellow pupils and teachers.



Two thoughts emerge from this: ensure that the holiday ahead provides proper time together and sustain that through the working weeks that follow; and how vital it is to have the right setting for a child. Time with our children should always be precious and kept as special, and there are many who have gone through those initial months making the child the centre of their existence. Realistically, as they grow older and more capable, and the pressures of busy lives return to adults, this time can diminish. And yet, their needs for us remain as strong as ever – even if they don't seek parents in the same way. We should never underestimate the importance that can be had on them as young people, and keep making time for them. I know they will often seek out the solace of the television, laptop or tablet, but the adults still can provide enormously for their development. Thus, I hope you can all give yourselves the time clear of your own pressures to share quality time with the family.

Equally important is to have great influences around your children. I never lose sight of the benefit of having caring staff throughout this school, whose attitude and approach are always about putting the child at the centre. Similarly, there are so many great children whose beliefs and kindness make them ideal peers. It is said that we are the average of the five people we spend most time with, in which case your children are in a fantastic position.




#### MAT pupils visit Haybridge High School
