A note from the Headmaster

It has been a pleasure to welcome everyone back for the new term, and so lovely to speak to so many children about their experiences over the Easter holiday. I was regaled with tales of visits to London, playing tabla at the Birmingham Conservatoire, holidays in India and tennis competitions. And lots and lots of robots being built: as I was showing some guests around the school, I was nearly knocked over by the amazing constructions, including the one that is almost adult-sized! It is great to see the children's creativity – a much underrated quality in life.

Our guests this week have included a group setting Escape Room challenges for the pupils, testing their problem-solving, teamwork and logical thinking; a busy Early Years Open Event; the Parent Engagement Group; and Independent Safeguarding Auditors. The latter are an important benefit of being a Cognita school, where the desire to be the best schools at looking after children is fully apparent. As a school, our approaches to safeguarding children were fully scrutinised and – as was found with the ISI Regulatory checks in November – we can be immensely proud of the procedures and processes we have in place.
