LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS

EID-UL-FITR

This week pupils in Year 3 have been learning all about the Islamic celebration of Eid-ul-Fitr. Together they learned how Muslims all around the world come celebrate together to the end of Ramadan. Year 3 have worked incredibly hard learning their lines for their assembly based on the topic.

Pupils also got creative and had fun decorating paper plates with the symbol of Islam.





PIZZA FRACTIONS!

This week in maths, Year 3 have been learning about fractions of amounts. On Wednesday, they became chefs and had fun applying this knowledge to making paper pizzas!

Pupils were given a variety of toppings and had to calculate the correct amount to add to their pizza. They used a number of methods including bar models and they also applied their knowledge of arithmetic facts.

ESCAPE FROM POMPEII

During their English lessons, Year 3 have been focusing on the book 'Escape from Pompeii'. This week, the children read on to find out what happened to the main characters, 'Tranio' and 'Livia'. In groups, pupils re-enacted the scene of Mount Vesuvius erupting; considering what the characters were thinking and feeling at the time. Pupils will eventually write a diary from Tranio's point of view.




MORE ABLE AND TALENTED

This week, the More Able and Talented (MAT) pupils in Key Stage 1 have been busy engaging in enriching and thought-provoking mathematical problems and puzzles.

Year 1 have been working hard with Mrs Chand to explore different ways of making symmetrical patterns with shapes and objects. The children were given the opportunity to discuss what makes one symmetrical pattern different, or the same, as another.

Year 2 pupils have been using their knowledge of number bonds to investigate different ways of making each line add up to 20. Mr Staffiere challenged them further to make their own puzzle for a partner to solve.
