Children especially had lots of fun getting messy making their own hand and footprints in paint.


SELF-PROTRAITS: SPOT THE RESEMBLANCE

COUNTING IN SEQUENCES

In Maths, Year 1 have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Children have enjoyed playing circle games which involved going around the circle and putting in either two thumbs, or five or ten fingers as they went around counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. They were very impressed that they managed to count in 5s and 10s to 130!

In English this week, children have started reading a new book.

Pupils have enjoyed predicting what the story could be about, how it could be similar and spotting differences when comparing it to the traditional fairy tale of Jack and the Beanstalk.

They have been taking part in role play, looking at how the main character might be thinking and what conversations he might have had with his parents about climbing the beanstalk.

They then made a conscience alley where the main character was given for and against advice about climbing the beanstalk.

The children then listened to the story and spotted interesting adjectives to use in their own writing.

In Science Year 1 are going to start looking at plants and the children will be planting runner beans in a cup with only a paper towel and water.

The children will be learning what plants need to grow and they will be seeing if the beans can grow without any soil.

With Sports Day fast approaching, our focus for this term will consist of plenty of practice in jumping, running, and throwing.

Pupils were full of energy this week, practising different jumping techniques such as speed bounce and a standing long jump.




