A NOTE FROM THE HEADMASTER

There are times as a Headmaster where all the stars align at once. Fortunately at Hydesville, I seem to experience more of those moments than some in other schools. A superb example has been seen across all three sections of the school this week.



Tuesday saw the first analysis of the Prep School GL assessment data. Looking at the class average scores, the teachers have done an incredible job to accelerate the learning of the children. Despite all the disruption of lockdown, bubble closures and individuals' self-isolation, the classes are securing scores that represent huge progress and learning this year. Well done to all in Prep for the excellence on display.

On Wednesday, I was conducting lesson observations in Nursery. To see our children playing with sandpits, water, and playdoh whilst engaging fully in mathematical development was a joy. Whether the Red group competing for who could come up with the best mental arithmetic for candles on a cake or the Green group deciding which was the best value catch, it was wonderful to see the learning in play.

Yesterday, I had the pleasure of listening to the Culture Awareness Assembly presented by four Year 10 boys. The time that went into their presentations and the importance of the message spoke volumes for them, but also the attitude within the Senior School. Banishing ignorance is key to solving many of the conflicts we see in the world, so this was a great example in action.

IF YOU GO DOWN THE WOODS TODAY...

Blue Group headed out for adventure in the outdoor classroom on Wednesday. On the way they met a real life teddy bear, who invited the children to join her for a teddy bear's picnic.

The children interacted with their peers and took part in role-play to enhance their imaginative skills which helped to develop their creativity and intellectual skills. They alsi had the chance to practise decision-making and other social skills, such as sharing and collaborating.



EXPLORING FOR NUMBERS!

We have used our rice and sand trays to hunt, find and match numerals to the correct number flashcards. Children demonstrated great control as they formed numerals in the sand and rice. We extended this further by performing simple calculations using the numbers and our fingers to find the answer.

Number recognition is a key part of maths for children in Early Years. It's all about their ability to recognise and read numeral digits. It also helps the children to understand both how the number system works, and how numbers relate to each other.



STORYTIME FUN!

We have taken our reading outside to the outdoor classroom where we chose our favourite books and took it in turns to read aloud to our peers. Reading books help our children to develop basic language and critical thinking skills and profoundly expand their vocabulary, much more than any other types of media.

WHAT SHALL WE PLAY WITH TODAY?




The piece is an old favourite that you might recognise, but to keep with the times, there's a
