LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS

MEET JEFF THE POTATO









5K have been studying reproduction in science and as part of their work, the children investigated what would happen if they placed an ordinary potato in some water.

The children observed the potato (now named Jeff!) regularly and were amazed to find that before long, it had begun to grow roots and shoots!

Jeff soon outgrew the cup and was planted out into one of the planters in school where it continues to flourish. Jeff the potato has demonstrated the process of asexual reproduction, being able to reproduce all by itself.5K have been using their gardening skills to look after Jeff.

They are hoping that enough potatoes will be produced for the class to be able to have one each so they can grow more 'Jeffs' at home.

Maybe you could try this at home too!

ADVENTURE IS WORTHWHILE

Year 5 children have had some adventures this term with two trips to Woodlands Outdoor Activity Centre.
