

HYDESVILLE NURSERY MAKE THEIR MARK

Pre-Prep children have been very busy getting back into the swing of the new term by demonstrating their excellent mark making skills.

They have enjoyed a variety of different mark making activities using a selection of mediums. We value the importance of allowing children to demonstrate the freedom to express themselves creatively and allow them to communicate their feelings through their drawings or even use their marks to tell a story!

Mark making is much more than just a scribble and has so many benefits in a child's development! This is the beginning of a child's journey towards writing and is an important step in a child's development for handwriting, creativity and coordination.

Physical development is enhanced by improving fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination is developed. These marks can also support emerging concepts of maths, developing into mathematical representation and enhancing learning.


FOREST FRIDAYS

We're opening our doors to prospective families on Saturday, 2nd October for our All School Open Morning.



Please also spread the word about our open event to any colleagues, friends and family who might be interested in their child joining the #Hydesvillefamily.


Hydesville parents are also very welcome to come along, especially Year 6 families, as the event will give you the opportunity to find out more about our Senior School.
