


# THE MAGIC OF READING

Teaching consonant-vowel-consonant words (CVC) words introduces children to the magic of transforming simple sounds into words. The goal is for pupils to use their knowledge of individual letter sounds to blend those sounds together and create a whole word, not just three individual sounds.

Learning CVC words also introduces children to the concept that words have a beginning, middle and ending sound that together create a word. Pupils enjoyed using the phonic blocks to practise blending and word-building CVC words.

#### OUT WITH THE OLD, IN WITH THE NEW!

Reception's focus during Topic this half term is 'old and new' and what a lot of fun we have all had!

After learning that many children in Victorian times could not afford toys so would make them themselves, pupils decided to make a cup and ball (which they all thoroughly enjoyed playing with!). They also enjoyed group discussions about which modern toy is their favourite and which toy would have been their favourite many years ago!

Pupils then moved onto old classrooms and modern-day classrooms where pupils were able to sort the items which belonged to a classroom in the past.



For Forest School this week, pupils headed out into the Arboretum. They discussed the changes in Autumn and the different types of trees. Pupils listened and followed instructions well to carry out leaf rubbing. This resource is an ideal way for children to explore leaves of different shapes, colours and textures from a variety of trees. It also helps them to develop different art techniques.

Pupils enjoyed watching from the side line!







# **CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY**

This week, pupils across Prep School have been studying Black History as part of Black History Month. Year 4 have focused on finding out about their own family history and have researched the life of a famous black person. They have also taken a look at the life of a black individual, who lived during the Tudor times. Jacques Francis was an African Salvage diver, who led the expedition to salvage King Henry VIII's guns from the Mary Rose. They learnt that he was the first African to give evidence in 1548 before an English court.





#### **TREASON IN YEAR 4!**

In English, Year 4 have been reading Treason by Berlie Doherty. This book is set during the Tudor times, in the court of Henry VIII. This past week, pupils have been horrified to discover that Margery - the 13-year-old sister of the main character - is to marry a 40-year-old friend of Henry VIII! 
Whilst pupils in Year 8 have tidied up areas that they were not able to as a result of a series of lockdowns, and now we are moving on to 'proper' year 8 work!
