A NOTE FROM THE HEADMASTER



It has been an incredibly busy week for the school, and one that has allowed us to celebrate the strength within. Open Morning last weekend saw almost sixty families visit us – almost double the numbers one might expect to see on a wet and windy Saturday! This is a reflection of the considerable reputation that we have now established, from Hydesville Nursery, to Prep and 11+ success, and to Senior GCSE results. We were filled with pride with the quality of our pupils showing the groups round: they were eloquent, engaging and polite: the visitors were highly admiring of their characters.

Secondly, we celebrated our two delayed Prizegiving events for Prep and Senior Schools, set in the new venue of Bescot Stadium. CHILDREN PUT HUMPTY TOGETHER AGAIN

Hydesville Nursery children have been busy demonstrating their advanced number skills by matching numbers from 1-5 and 1-10 whilst putting Humpty together again!





ARGHHHHHHHHHH! LOOK OUT, SPIDERS ARE ABOUT.....!

Hydesville Nursery children have enjoyed releasing their creative side by constructing and making their very own paper plate spiders and sparkly webs as they continue to learn about Incy Wincy Spider and little Miss Muffet.

Completing both activities enabled children to develop their fine motor skills, pincer grip, control and co-ordination when using different sized paint brushes to paint the plate and follow the pencil lines to create their webs. Childrens' mathematical skills were also tested during the activity as they counted how many legs were needed for their spiders and discussed their shape and sizes.

Yellow Group also made shape spiders where children placed the spider template in the right places. They also discovered that spiders have eight legs and live in webs.

CELEBRATING NAVARATRI

Navaratri (nine nights) is one of the greatest Hindu festivals. It symbolises the triumph of good over evil.

Hydesville Nursery children celebrated the festival by dressing up in colourful outfits and demonstrating their coordination and agility to perform the Garba dance.

Children also designed their own Navratri celebration outfit.



YEAR 3 BECOME VIKINGS!

Year 3 have been enjoying learning about the Vikings in their Dragonology topic this term. As part of the lesson this week the children played a Viking trade game. We split the class into 2 groups, The Vikings and The Anglo Saxons. Each group were set up with the role of producers, traders and a leader. They had to use their battering skills to exchange goods and obtain the best value swaps for their team. The children were very enthusiastic and enjoyed their Viking trading experience. In art children have been thinking about the Viking trade and have made beautiful collages of Viking Long boats.



HOW TO TRAIN YOUR DRAGON.....

This week pupils in Year 3 have been writing their own stories based on the class text 'How to Train Your Dragon'. We have been sharing ideas as a class and then writing our stories in a calm environment using ambient music and lighting.



YEAR 4 GET ARTY

Mrs Rees is incredibly proud of our Prep School artists, and has reported some fantastic artwork has already been created this term, both in lessons and during after school art club.

Year 4 have been working on portraiture this half term, learning about the structure of the face and how to draw the features of the face, adding tone and shade.

Pupils have each now drawn their own symmetrical self portraits which are proudly displayed in the school corridor and next they willbe looking at Cubism and creating portraits 'Picasso' style. We can't wait to see what they produce!



HAVING FUN WITH NUMBERS

In maths, Year 3 have been exploring a variety of methods when adding 1 and 2 digit numbers to 3 digit numbers. Children have been using the 'concrete method' using practical resources followed by the 'pictorial method' where they show their working out through diagrams and finally using the 'abstract method'. Pupils have then applied these techniques to reasoning and problem solving questions. Some great work, Year 3!


ENRICHMENT PROVES A HIT WITH PUPILS

WINTER UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS



As we enter Autumn, pupils will begin to wear outdoor coats and accessories. We would just like to remind Prep & Senior School families about our uniform expectations. Thank you for your support in ensuring our high standards in appearance.

CRESTED

PREP SCHOOL

Outdoor coats should be purchased from our supplier Crested School Wear, and school blazers should be brought to school each day and can be worn underneath coats. Dark green scarves, hats and gloves without motifs may also be worn by pupils during outdoor playtime and activities. Pupils may wear boots and wellies during snow conditions to and from school, and change in to school shoes whilst in lessons. School hats and caps must be worn each day.

SENIOR SCHOOL

Outdoor coats should be black or navy and pupils should wear their school blazer underneath their coat. Black scarves, black woollen hats and black gloves without motifs may also be worn by pupils outdoors. Boots may only be worn in snow conditions (N.B. A boot is anything fitting on or above the ankle bone). School bags should also be predominantly black.
