## LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS

## EYFS: Reception



#### GUESS HOW MUCH I LOVE YOU....

Pupils thoroughly enjoyed a whole afternoon based around love. We talked about kindness, how we can be kind to others around us, and what it means to be a good friend. Valentine's Day teaches children about feelings, different types of love and self-expression. We have been on a special look out this week to see who is being kind and considerate......



# ARTISTS IN THE MAKING

Pupils enjoyed drawing a landscape picture of the beautiful Arboretum using pastel colours. Pupils were engaged and involved for the whole lesson. The objective is to introduce the concept of observation and careful looking, but time and space to explore the page, available materials and environment.







# OUR OUTDOOR SCAVENGER HUNT

Pupils worked with a partner to explore their surroundings in the Arboretum. We looked for items such as daisies, stones, thick sticks, thin sticks, pine cones and pine needles.

Pupils felt a sense of achievement when they found an item they could tick off their list. This activity encourages children to use and develop their observation skills.







# THE VERY HUNGRY CATERPILLAR



Pupils have been learning about the main events in the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and learning about the different components that make a book.





Pupils have been encouraged to identify the main events in the story, count to 10 with confidence, recite the days of the week and recognise different fruit. Pupils worked in pairs to sequence the story in chronological order, recalling what happens in the beginning, middle and end of the story.

## LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS

# Prep - 46

#### STEM GLIDERS

In science, Year 6 are currently completing their STEM unit. Each week they are presented with a new challenge designed to test their science, technology, engineering and mathematics skills. Over the last week, they were challenged to design and build a glider, taking inspiration from NASA and the Red Arrows display team. They then performed a series of test flights, taking note of performance to adjust overall mass and improve aerodynamics. Finally, pupils recorded the distance (m) and time taken (s) during flight to calculate and compare the speed (m/s) of their gliders. Challenging, fun and hands-on learning!



#### MATHS SHOPPING CHALLENGE - ALDI OR TESCO?



As part of their Decimals unit in maths, Year 6 were set a challenge with a real-life context: Tesco or Aldi – which is the cheapest supermarket? Pupils were tasked with applying their knowledge of dividing decimals by integers to calculate the best value items across the two supermarkets. After much calculation, the results were in – Aldi was the cheapest supermarket across our selection of items by a mammoth £0.07! In calculating this, the pupils not only extended their calculation skills, but acquired a broad range of essential life skills too.



#### THE TRANSATLANTIC SLAVE TRADE



In Topic, Year 6 pupils have been learning about the Transatlantic slave trade and how this impacted the continent of Africa and its people. This links with the novel 'Journey to Jo'burg studied in English in relation to South Africa's colonial past. Children have been able to analyse a range of primary and secondary historical sources to understand what happened in this painful chapter of history. Furthermore, they have studied the abolitionist movement which brought the slave trade to an end.



#### OUR CENTRE FOR EXCELLENCE IN 11+ PREPARATION

The children have continued working hard in their tuition groups this term, with the focus turning to developing their maths and English skills. In Year 5, the tutors have adapted their lessons to accommodate the changes to the entrance examination for the Birmingham consortium of schools, where there has been a return to using GL as the test provider. Pupils are already exposed the essential techniques for this style of testing from Year 2, with focused technique lessons in Years 3 and 4 already being part of our reasoning curriculum. However, we are now taking the time to recap these skills in the English tuition sessions to ensure that the children are prepared for both CEM and GL styles of testing. As further support, the Year 5 group have already started using an online learning platform as part of their sessions, and this will be rolled out to Year 4 before the end of this block of lessons.





## LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS

#### LET MY PEOPLE GO!



Since the beginning of the Spring term Year 7 pupils have been exploring the beliefs and practices of the religion of Judaism. Having previously completed a unit of work on 'Why do people believe?'

Pupils began the year well equipped to explore a world faith in depth. So far pupils have explored different Jewish beliefs about the nature of G-d and important patriarchs within the Jewish faith.

They have looked at the figure of Abraham and the significance of Israel to the Jewish faith.

Of late, pupils have predominantly focused upon the prophet Moses and the exodus from Egypt. A story which also holds importance in both Islam and Christianity.

#### UPDATE FROM THE HEAD OF YEAR 10

Year 10 pupils have had a good first half of the spring term, with assessments in various subjects in full swing. It is fair to say that they already understand the rigours of GCSE studies, and are taking it in their stride.

Strong winds and heavy rains aside, the focus is good and the determination is strong- this year group has been upbeat and enthusiastic this term, and they are intent on hitting all their targets before the end of the year!

As far as social responsibilities go, there are already whispers about prefectship... many very keen to take on duties that will keep them in good stead when the time comes. A very good excuse for me to delegate!
