This week Yellow Group have been playing in shaving foam.

Sensory play is important for development as it encourages the children to explore and investigate, it helps build nerve connections in the brain and develops fine motor skills, plus its messy and fun!. The children used brushes to mark make and paint their hands. The children were encouraged to describe what it feels like, they used words such as soft, fluffy and soapy, and it looked like snow! It was great fun.



Two ambassadors awards for kindness and anti-bullying.


A Y8 winning best acrostic poem for antibullying week.
