The highlight of the day was when they sang 'chick, chick, and chicken' to the hens, and the children received their very own freshly laid egg to take home for their tea.

Luckily the fine weather meant they could also enjoy a picnic lunch outdoors and take time to play in the adventure playground.

VICTORIAN LIFE FOR RECEPTION

Pupils thoroughly enjoyed their day of experiencing life as a Victorian child at the Black Country Museum. It was an eye-opening visit to see how a child's life was so different from our own and the struggles they would have faced. We visited lots of different homes and quickly came to the realisation that we couldn't see any bathrooms inside; the children and their families had to wash and use the toilet at the bottom of their garden!

On our tours, we also visited a Victorian school. After being told to stand in two separate lines (one line of boys and one line of girls) we were led inside by a very strict Victorian teacher who was holding a cane. During the lesson, our hands were inspected for cleanliness; the teacher was horrified when he reached Mrs Jones and she even received the cruel punishment of facing the wall with her hands on her head! Our teacher also taught us how to use 'hooks and hangers' to produce perfect Victorian handwriting and to say the alphabet backwards!

During the day, we also visited lots of Victorian shops such as the chemist where we learnt about Victorian medicine, the butchers, hardware store and the greengrocers. It was such a fantastic day and pupils learnt new facts to support their learning.

LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS

WHEELY GOOD FUN!



Year 3 dusted off the trundle wheels and learned how to measure perimeter. Using tape measures, meter sticks and trundle wheels we measured the perimeters of various classroom items, including books, boards and even the perimeter of the classroom itself. Children had to choose the most appropriate tool and unit of measure to record their results accurately. This week we have recapped money and multiplication and begun work on fractions. Usually, the word fractions instils fear into pupils but using a growth mindset they have made an excellent start and some even said, "I don't even know why I was worried!" With a little determination and resilience our pupils will master fractions and I'm sure they will love their maths homework next week....

THE GREAT KAPOK TREE

Year 3 have been reading The Great Kapok tree and discussing the dilemma the character faces. After exploring the different animals that live in the rainforest, they talked about the reasons why the Kapok tree was so important to them, and why the man shouldn't cut it down. It stimulated lots of conversations about deforestation, the effect it has globally and the changes we can make to prevent it. Afterwards, pupils took on the role of the animals and the man from the story and used their best persuasive language to convince him to leave the tree and save their home.



SCIENCE: THE POWER OF FORCES

During the last few weeks Year 3 have enjoyed some practical science lessons where they have been investigating forces. They used a straw and a ping pong ball to find out how they could use air as a force to move things. They made their own windmills and tested them outside to see how the blades moved in different ways depending on where they were standing in the playground, the wind strength and the angle they were holding their windmill. This week we tested different surfaces on a ramp to see how friction would effect a car travelling along it. Next week we are looking forward to testing magnetic forces.




ART ROUND UP: UPPER PREP




NURSERY & RECEPTION EASTER FUN CLUB
