Taking part in hands-on cooking activities help children to develop communication and language skills, independence, problem-solving, fine motor skills and many other fundamental skills.




### BUILDING WITH A PURPOSE IN MIND


# LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS

### THINKING ABOUT SCIENCE



At the end of last term, Years 3 and 4 went on a Science Trip to ThinkTank in Birmingham. Whilst there, the pupils had the opportunity to participate in a science workshop, linked to their most recent topic in science, for Year 4 this was changing state. The pupils had the opportunity to catch carbon dioxide in a balloon and produced slime as part of a chemical reaction. Additionally, pupils visited the galleries and interacted with a range of activities, including one looking at the human digestive system, which will hopefully aid them in their science studies this half term.





### SECRETS OF A SUN KING

This week, Year 4 have started studying a new book- Secrets of a Sun King by Emma Carroll

This links in with our topic of 'Tomb Raiders' which looks at Ancient Egypt. The pupils have been introduced to one of the main characters, Lillian, and have discovered that some strange events could be linked to an ancient Egyptian curse. The question is, will Lillian be able to save her grandad, Ezra, before the curse gets to him too...?

### HOLIDAY HOMEWORK

Over the Easter holidays, Year 4 were set the challenge of completing a project all about coasts. They looked at the Holbeck Hall Hotel disaster, found out about the features of coastlines and produced leaflets to provide information for visitors to a seaside town of their choice. As an additional challenge, the pupils were asked to create a 'beach in a box' and here you can see Asees and Rianah with their wonderful creations.





# CITY NATURE CHALLENGE – BECOME A CITIZEN SCIENTIST

In today's Assembly from the Black Country Wildlife Trust, pupils were told about what it is to be a 'Citizen Scientist' and how we can all take part in an event this weekend to become one.

City Nature Challenge are running a world-wide project to discover more about the flora and fauna in our cities. Everyone is being asked to head outside in their local area to observe the plants and wildlife around them. They can identify and photograph plants, animals, and other organisms on their own or as part of a BioBlitz. With adult permission, pupils can use the iNaturalist app or iNaturalist.org to upload their observations and add them to a global database of biodiversity to support local to global research projects.

# AN UPDATE FROM THE GEOGRAPHY DEPT...


Welcome to the final term of the academic year in geography. We are particularly pleased with the gradual changes in the weather and are looking forward to brighter days of sunshine ahead.

Further down, life in KS3 continues as normal; pupils are exploring both the physical and human aspects of geography, across the year groups, relating textbook theories to everyday realities.




