After the picnic, the children had lots of fun taking part in a variety of teddy themed activities.












#### A CINDERELLA STORY



### HALF TERM UPDATE FROM THE MUSIC DEPT

YEAR 4 are currently realising how often maths appears in music. This half term we have looked at time signatures, which tell us how many beats are in a song and counting in different metre from the common 4 beats a bar to 3/4 and 2/4. Everyone had fun dancing the waltz to 3/4, marching to 2/4 and exploring 4/4 at different tempi (speeds).



People rest for many reasons. In music it might be to catch your breath, allow another instrument to flourish, or to mark the end of a phrase, much like a full stop. YEAR 5 have been learning to identify the symbols for these rests from half beat rests up to four and then putting it into practise.



A musical piece about a dog called Dan. Just one of the 14 variations of a theme created the composer Edward Elgar to represent people (and animals) in his life. YEAR 6 have been learning about the 'Enigma Variations', creating their own variations of his theme, to ultimately lead them into creating their own theme with subsequent variations. Last year we had all sorts of variations from animal representations, to dog breeds and marvel characters. Mr Hill-Jayne can't wait to hear what we have this year!
