
#### CELEBRATING SCIENCE DAY

As Prep School have had Science Day this week, pupils in Year 5 decided to extend their science lessons too.

To support positive environmental change (something dear to Year 5), students looked at how they could repurpose plastic bags. They came up with some very creative ideas.

Lots of exciting and creative activities have been taking place over the Summer Term. Year 1 have been using photographs to explore shops in the past while Year 2 have been walking around the Arboretum to practise their map skills. Year 3 have been combining their knowledge of 3D shapes with historical knowledge to build Roman structures and Year 4 applied their understanding of Egyptian mummification to tomatoes! Year 5 have been exploring life in Victorian Britain whereas Year 6 have travelled to Ancient Greece.

### **MONEY TALKS!**


Over the last few lessons, Year 9 have been completing some activities on Money Week.
