The first event has just started and is now in its tenth year, the Alan Turing Cryptography Competition is aimed at secondary school children in the UK up to Year 11. In his relatively short life, Alan Turing code-breaker, mathematician and founding father of computer science — made a unique impact on the history of computing, computer science, artificial intelligence, developmental biology, and the mathematical theory of computability.
