Communication	Encouraging the children to talk more at length about their pets and favourite animals.

Development	<ul> <li>Children will learn their own lines and perform the Nativity in front of an audience.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Children will continue to develop their ability to work with a partner and within a group.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Children will learn the importance of being kind, honest, respectful and well-mannered through weekly PSHE lessons.</li> </ul>

Physical	Continuing to develop fine-motor skills through creative tasks.
Development	Making our own healthy milkshake and discussing healthy and less healthy foods.

Dance	Practising responding appropriately to music.
	To be able to enact stories through dance
	<ul> <li>To be able to make good use of their developed foot skills through little sequences with a partner.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Developing types of movement associated with different animals.</li> </ul>
PE	<ul> <li>Developing and refining a range of ball skills including throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting, and aiming.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Developing confidence, competence, precision, and accuracy when engaged in activities that involve a ball.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>To be able to experiment with and develop increasingly complex ways of travelling.</li> </ul>
Literacy	<ul> <li>Read a range of stories relating to the topic 'Animals', with writing tasks based around these stories.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Continue to sequence narratives and retell stories in our own words.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Begin to reliably write cvc words using phonic knowledge e.g. dog, cat.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Learn to read and write the tricky words 'the', 'to, 'go', 'no', 'I'.</li> </ul>
	Continue to practise blending sounds to read words.
	<ul> <li>Continue to practise segmenting words for spelling.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Practise writing captions containing 'a' and 'and'.</li> </ul>

Maths	Deciding how to sort and categorise animals.
	<ul> <li>Looking at the 'difference' between two numbers and what this means.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Encouraging reliable understanding of 'one more' and 'one less' of a number to 5 (and then to 10).</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Solving addition and subtraction problems using images and objects for support.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Looking at 3D shapes (including cube, cone, sphere, pyramid, cylinder, cuboid) and identifying them in everyday</li> </ul>
	objects.
Understanding	<ul> <li>Understanding which farm animals provide which products.</li> </ul>
the World	<ul> <li>Understanding that different animals require different environments and habitats to survive.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Understanding which animals are considered to be endangered and how we can help.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Continue to develop mouse control and use i-pads to take photographs.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Looking at farms and farm machinery from the past and present.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Learn what a farmer does (read the story Farmer Duck).</li> </ul>
	Discuss vegetarianism and different types of diets.
Computing	Continue to teach the importance of e-safety.
	Developing mouse and keyboard skills.
	Learning to program floor robots.
