On Wednesday, our senior geographers, along with our Chief Geographer (our very own Mrs Samra!) traversed the hills of the Long Mynd - an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty - for their GCSE rivers fieldwork.

Did you know that the river that flows through Carding Mill valley has a name, The Ashbrooke? Geographers classify it as a river, whereas the layman will simply refer to it as a stream.

River or stream, our senior pupils put theory to good practise when they measured channel depths and widths, investigated changes in the discharge of the river along its length, and compared sediment load at the upper, middle and lower courses of The Ashbrooke.

The day wasn't just about studying, however, as the intrepid group also had chance to also enjoy the spectacular landscape, with the good weather on their side!

Mrs Odunjo is particularly proud of all the pupils, who conducted themselves with respect and had regard for the public and the environment.



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It won't be long until Year 11 pupils leave Hydesville and continue their educational journey at their chosen sixth form destination. This week, we have been helping pupils prepare for their next steps with some mock interviews. Thanks to our very own Mrs Samra along with Mike Williams from Walsall College and Mike Smith from Apprenticeship Works who helped put our pupils through their paces. They learnt lots about how to handle interview questions, and gain tips on what sorts of questions they will be asked on.

It's been a week of geography trips at Hydesville. Pupils in Year 4 also visited Carding Mill Valley on Wednesday, to finish off their study on rivers.

They started the day by completing some sketches and watercolour paintings of the valley, with many including the river and its meanders and some of the many sheep who call Carding Mill their home.

After lunch, they went invertebrate dipping with the groups finding many mayfly and dragonfly nymphs along with some water snails, a freshwater shrimp and even some fish eggs!

Finally, the pupils studied the velocity of the river in different parts of the it and discussed why the flow of the river varied at different parts of its course.

A fun – and educational day – was had by all!

Pupils and staff across the school showed their support for the fight against food waste as part of Stop Food Waste Day.

Following a Prep School assembly which shared the ideas from the Eco-Committee, pupils were encouraged to select their food carefully and talk to the lunch staff about the size of portion they would like.

Members of the Eco-Committee made a pledge to inspire others to waste less and monitored how much food was being wasted.



The campaign was also supported by Mr Long and the Chartwells catering team. Mr Long is pleased to report that our food waste has decreased over the week. Yesterday, we calculated 20kg less waste than previous days. Well done everyone in helping reduce our impact on the environment!
