EYFS: Hydesville Nursery

MAKING OUR MARK

Red Group have been very busy demonstrating their fantastic mark-making skills. We made the most of the sunshine by mark-making outdoors using water and paintbrushes. As children grow and develop, they begin to learn to better control their movements. They practise using the muscles in their hand in order to draw and their hand-eye coordination develops. These are essential skills for learning to write.

Mark-making also gives children the opportunity to express themselves, communicate their feelings and explore their environment. Through making patterns and swirls, children develop their creativity and imagination.

Children can mark make using a variety of tools, including pens, pencils, paint brushes, sticks or just their fingertips. You don't even need paint; water can be just as fun!





SENSORY FUN

Children loved exploring the mini-beast sensory trays. Sensory play is great for children's learning and development by helping strengthen connections in the brain. This week children have thoroughly enjoyed messy play with cornflour, these activities help in the development of children's language and communication skills, as well as cognitive, and gross and fine motor skills.



MAKING MUSIC

Red Group children enjoyed exploring musical instruments within circle time this week. Incorporating music into routines and play in the early years has a positive influence on your child's early development. It can get them moving, thinking and inspire creativity.

WEEKLY ROUND UP....

Prep School: Year 2



It's been a busy term already for pupils in Year 2. In art they have been using materials and tools to sculpt a hand. They achieved some amazing results!



Pupils have been learning about data handling in computing. They collected all their own data by asking question to their peers, and then put all of the data into a table to see the results.







During Science lessons, the children learnt about the important of keeping fit and healthy. They designed their own workouts and took it in turns to do them with the class.



In Geography pupils have been improving their mapping skills. They looked at local area maps and found features as the motorway, railway and canals. We noticed features such as Sutton Park and made comparisons to how the countryside looked compared to the larger towns as there were a lot more roads and houses in these towns.

The children also made comments about the junctions on the motorway and the different symbols features in OS maps such as the fish and boating symbols.



11+ PREPARATION

Year 5's preparation for the 11+ exam in September is well under way. In the coming weeks, pupils will continue to practise their skills in English, Maths, Verbal and Non-Verbal Reasoning and working to time limits. In addition, there will be the opportunity to experience 'mock exams' to develop pupils' test technique and their confidence when facing challenging situations.

SENIOR PUPILS RISE TO THE CHALLENGE

Six senior school pupils achieved four bronze, two silver and one gold in this year's UKMT Junior Maths Challenge.

Over 250,000 pupils from across the UK sat the Junior Maths Challenge, which is run by Leeds University.

Approximately 6% of entrants receive a gold certificate, the next 13% silver and the next 21% bronze.

The highest score in the school came from Leo from Year 7 who deserves a special mention. The silver award went to Samraaj and the Bronze awards to Hasmeet, Rohan, Musa and Dhaya.




Pupils in Year 4 had a fantastic hands-on lesson in identifying Ancient Egyptian artefacts last week when they were visited by representatives from Sandwell Museum.

The pupils had the chance to hold and explore various artefacts and speculate about what they could be, as well as seeing some replicas of pieces. There was much excitement when they saw a real-life mummified head!







Mr Burnham explains: "We began in the beautiful village of Hartington and walked at a comfortable pace, trying to avoid cows, cowpats and flies to much hilarity. Eventually, we reached the River Dove and the pupils were in awe of the tranquil setting of steep valley sides and blue skies overhead.

Wow, what an achievement RD. Well done to you all!



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
