EYFS: Hydesville Nursery

AS TALL AS A GIRAFFE. AS SMALL AS A MOUSE

On Wednesday Blue Group looked and talked about how tall they are. They used their height chart to measure each other and compare their heights as a group.

From completing this activity, children were able to establish that Leah was the tallest, measuring 138cm,, followed by Aayah at 132cm, Roman at 129cm, Ziya at 126cm and Rudhra measured the shortest at 123cm.










In Maths children have been busy counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. They have been brilliant at making equal groups and this week they started off learning about 'Arrays'.

A MESSAGE FROM MRS BOOTH.....

As GCSE examinations loom for Year 11, as well as internal assessments for Years 7-10, it's important to consider the positive impact that reading can have on your mental health. Independent reading for 20 minutes at least 3 times a week has a dramatic impact on vocabulary and comprehension skills, but can also aid better relaxation and sleep – especially during periods of anxious revision!

In addition, re-reading familiar texts can help you to spot new and interesting connections: particularly useful for the higher level analysis and evaluation skills as part of pupils' English Language and English Literature courses.

Before I begin my maternity leave, I'd like to wish Year 11 the very best for their future examinations and I have given them each a bookmark to remind them of the many positive benefits of independent reading.
