### WEEKLY ROUND UP....

### EYFS: Reception

In ICT this half term Reception have been looking at programming. The children were introduced to what 'programming' meant and then witnessed some examples of following a set of directional instructions.

Once the children were confident which way to turn, they were introduced to a programmable toy called a BEE-BOT.

The children were so excited to see a toy following their set of instructions.

They were then put into small groups of two or three and were allowed to take it in turns to make the BEE-BOT move. They worked together to make the BEE-BOT travel from one place to another and realised it was not as easy as they thought. Many of the BEE-BOTS ended up in a completely different place!

Once the children were more confident on programming the BEE-BOTs they decided to have a race to see which one would reach the finish line first.

The children are now looking forward to the next lesson where they are going to create their own set of instructions to make the BEE-BOT travel in different directions to find the 'treasure'.









This term Reception have been looking at the seaside and what lives in the sea, so they decided to create their own fish using a paper plate.

The children were provided with paint, glue, tissue paper and a wide selection of resources nearby and they were given the instructions to create whatever sort of fish they would like and to use any resources they required.

The following day they wrote their own instructions on how they created their own individual fish using time words.

All children thoroughly enjoyed this activity, and every single fish is different and with its own character. One pupil even added razor sharp teeth to their fish and another added a crown because they were the 'king of the sea.'

### WEEKLY ROUND UP....

### Prep School: Year 4

#### WHY DO WE HAVE DIFFERENT TYPES OF TEETH?



In science class this week, pupils explored the functions of different teeth. They began by comparing kitchen utensils to teeth and how they break down food. Then, they had the challenge of eating apple slices and dried apricots to understand the roles of incisors, canines, and molars while eating various foods.

#### TRIP ADVISOR REVIEW BASED ON THE TRAIN JOURNEY IN 'SECRETS OF A SUN KING'

In English, pupils focused on Chapter 11 of "Secrets of a Sun King," where the main character embarks on a train journey. They were challenged to write a review for 'Trip advisor' evaluating the train's facilities and rating the journey. Year 4 engaged with this activity with great enthusiasm which suggests they may have a promising future as budding travel critics. Who knows, we may see some of their captivating reviews on 'Trip advisor' in the years to come!



### **MUMMIFICATION MADNESS!**

Following a visit from Sandwell Museum services and seeing the mummy's head, the pupils were inspired to carry out some of their own mummification. After much consideration, the pupils decided that it would be a good idea if we used a tomato for this, rather than an actual person! The pupils got to work on removing the internal organs from the tomatoes (the seeds) before washing it in Nile water (hand sanitiser).

Once the body (tomato) had been prepared it was filled and covered in natron (a mixture of salt and bicarbonate of soda) before it was placed in a coffin (zip-clock bag) and buried in the deep, dark depths of random locations in the Year 4 classrooms, so that it can dry out. In 20 days' time, the pupils will retrieve their tomatoes and see what impact the natron has had on the overall weight and condition of the body!

# RECYCLED MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

Mrs Rees has been really impressed with Year 4 in their Art and ST lessons this term: they have made musical instruments from recycled materials.


We are blown away with what the three children are doing, it looks like we have some super STEM whizz-kids in our school!
