Global be Well Day

On Friday 30th September the school stopped lessons as we celebrated the importance of Global Be Well Day. All staff and children came dressed in their sports and leisure clothes. The Prep School started with an assembly led by Mrs Dhadda who talked about the different parts of the Wellbeing charter and this discussion led to the importance of looking after our physical and mental wellbeing and people around us.

During the morning the whole school completed activities based around mindfulness, digital wellbeing and sleep activities. Some completed yoga activities and colouring mindfulness pictures and worry bags.

The afternoon was spent having lots of fun completing the water fun run which everyone thoroughly enjoyed, and several members of staff got soaked by the P.E staff and helpers. Also, all of Prep made their own fruit kebabs and Upper Prep had food workshops with Chartwells.

The Senior School children raised money for a worthy charity by selling samosas, providing/creating glitter tattoos which were very popular with the younger children and of course having two sumo suits and playing football and chasing their teachers around whilst they wore them.

Senior, Prep and Nursery children helped to raise money for the Charlie Waller Trust. The charity was set up by Charlie's family after he tragically took his own life. It was created to raise awareness around depression and to ensure young people are able to understand and look after their own mental health. Senior pupils had the chance to hear Haleem's story about his battle with depression and how he got through this difficult time in his life.

Giving our time to charity and helping others is one of the 6 contributors to well-being from the Cognita Be Well Charter. The charity ambassadors helped to organise the various activities on the playground, and raised £387.00!

Senior pupils learnt about how media and technology affect their values, thinking traps caused by online activity, changing tech habits and how tech companies try to keep young children online. Senior pupils also learnt about the importance of good sleep habits for their academic success, mental well-being, and physical health.









Black History Month



Black History Month 2023 is a national occasion to recognise and celebrate the invaluable contributions of black people to British society. This year, the focus for Black History Month is designed to celebrate the exceptional achievements of black women. This year's theme of 'Saluting our Sisters' highlights the crucial role that black women have played in shaping history, inspiring change, and building communities. Within school the senior pupils have celebrated this topic in assembly and had the opportunity to participate in a number of activities throughout the month of October including a Black History Film Club focusing on the success of Venus and Serena Williams in the film King Richard and learning about the thrilling and inspirational life of an iconic American freedom fighter Harriet Tubman. The film Harriet tells the extraordinary tale of Harriet Tubman's escape from slavery and transformation into one of America's greatest heroes. Her courage, ingenuity, and tenacity freed hundreds of slaves and changed the course of history. Additionally, pupils have been encouraged to enter the National Black History Month Poetry Competition 2023 and complete an in-school quizsheet.

We would like to say a huge congratulations to Hydesville Tower pupils; Saranya and Kartar, for taking part in their first Karate competition recently and competing in the Kata category.


They train under Sensei Paul here at Hydesville in Wado Kai Karate. We would like to say a special well done to Saranya as she won a bronze medal.
