

The children enjoyed counting the play money whilst purchasing their shopping and had the opportunity to mark make when writing their shopping lists.



The children showed focus and determination to understand this topic. They are now looking forward to practising these skills in their daily maths lessons.





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



Finally, bonne chance to Year 11 who are preparing for their forthcoming examinations, they are working so hard!














Sports


Year 3 and 4 are enjoying fencing in their Games sessions.
