



# Planting

We have been planting and creating our own caterpillar grass heads.

The children have used trowels to fill up tights with soil before sprinkling grass seeds on top of the soil. They then added elastic bands to create the body before adding eyes and antenna's. The children will then be able to observe and note changes and talk about how the caterpillars hair is growing.

From completing this growing activity enabled the children to engage and use a range of senses and helps the children to develop and recognise them without realising. They were able to feel the texture of the soil and seeds and smell the different scents. It also helps to develop hand-eye coordination and builds physical strength.










# Nursery









We have looked at the story of the Gingerbread man before looking at different shapes and features that we can use to decorate our own gingerbread man / lady.

It was nice to see the children interacting and talking with their peers about the different textures, it showed that they were all thinking and being creative.

Gold-100 questions in 10 minutes- all times tables up to 12x12

Diamond-100 questions in 7 minutes-up to 12x12 and including related facts (e.g 30x60,  $\frac{1}{8}$  of 56, 0.3x0.4,  $\frac{1}{4}$ 9)

Hall of Fame-50 questions at Diamond level against the clock-5 seconds are added for every error.

Remember you have to get all of the questions right (Bronze-Diamond).

You are allowed up to 2 mistakes for a call-back, but you must then answer correctly.

A huge congratulations to Hydesville and The Shrubbery who came first and second, respectively.










