


Year 6 Take on Ninja Warrior UK!

Prep School - World Environment Day

To celebrate World Environment Day, pupils took part in a variety of activities designed to raise awareness about the environment and encourage sustainable living. Children enjoyed hands-on activities including nature walks, litter picks, eco-themed crafts and planting projects. Many classes explored ways to reduce their carbon footprint and made pledges to adopt more eco-friendly habits at home and in school.







Year 4 Eco-projects


Year 4 have started an exciting new science unit on human impact on the environment. To launch their learning, they visited the Arboretum, where they helped the local community by picking up litter. The children then sorted the litter into groups and discussed which types were most harmful to the environment and why. They explored the effects of pollution on wildlife and natural habitats, deepening their understanding of the consequences of human actions. Inspired to make a difference, the pupils created eye-catching posters encouraging visitors to pick up litter, which will soon be displayed in the Arboretum café to help spread their important message.

Following their litter pick and discussions about environmental harm, the children are now conducting a science experiment to explore how different types of litter decompose. They have buried a selection of common waste materials—such as paper, plastic, and food scraps—and will be observing any changes over the next few weeks. By checking on their samples regularly and recording their findings, the children will learn which materials break down naturally and which ones persist in the environment. This hands-on investigation will help them understand the importance of reducing waste and making environmentally friendly choices

Accelerated Reader

Congratulations to our Year 7 pupils who, so far this year, have read a phenomenal 9,124,419 words in their independent reading! On average, pupils in Year 7 have been reading for 45 minutes per day and this will have an immense positive impact on their academic success.


All pupils in Key Stage 3 follow the Accelerated Reader independent reading programme which encourages pupils to develop the confidence to read independently from a range of both fiction and non-fiction genres. Parents are able to monitor this through their Home Connect log ins and teachers can easily see pupils who may need further encouragement and support to achieve reading fluency and understanding.

Year 8 pupils are going one step further by rising to our challenge of reading 'Nine before Year 9': a carefully curated selection of texts to introduce the complex and mature themes and ideas ready for the step up to Year 9.

Finally, we continue to be proud supporters of the Lit in Colour Pioneer programme, championing texts from diverse authors, including Coram Boy by Jamilla Gavin (Year 8) and Refugee Boy by Benjamin Zephaniah (Year 9).









Year 8 Maths Department: Mirror Image Transformations

This term, Year 8 pupils have been exploring the fascinating concept of symmetry through mirror image transformations. The maths department challenged them to complete half-portraits of animals by accurately producing their mirror images using their newly learned skills.

The results were outstanding! Students demonstrated a solid understanding of symmetry as they reflected half-portraits to create full, visually striking animal images. This project not only strengthened their grasp of mathematical transformations but also gave them a wonderful opportunity to showcase their artistic creativity.

A montage of their work reveals a wonderful variety of animals and artistic styles. Each piece highlights the pupils' dedication to precision and the mathematical principles behind symmetry, resulting in beautifully balanced and detailed images.






Science News - Year 7 & Year 8


Year 7 - Electricity in the Home


This term, Year 7 pupils have been exploring the topic of Electricity as part of their Physics studies. They've taken a hands-on approach, designing, building, and testing electrical circuits in class. These practical activities help pupils understand how circuits work and give them valuable insight into how electrical systems power the everyday devices we rely on.



Year 8 - Chemistry and Biology

In Chemistry, Year 8 pupils have been investigating important environmental issues including global warming, acid rain, and global dimming. They have produced some fantastic posters outlining the causes, consequences, and potential solutions to reduce the impact of these problems on our planet. In Biology, pupils are diving into Ecology, learning about the biotic (living) and abiotic (non-living) factors that shape ecosystems. We're excited to see how their understanding develops as they continue to explore the natural world.


