The session left Year 2 buzzing with ideas, eager to start creating their own stories using inspiration from their own lives.






















WEEKLY ROUND UP PREP WALK TO SCHOOL WEEK

Cyber Crime Awareness: Police Visit for Years 9 & 10




Esha's story, a tribute to VE Day

I remember so much from the war, more than anything though, I remember my husband dying in front of me. Imagine the love of your life dying for your country, his life taken off him. I still get flashbacks of when I saw his body limp on the ground. I had to mollify to help the other injured soldiers that fought by his side. I am relieved that years of conflict and hardship were finally coming to an end. But I have no family to celebrate this day with me.

When our prime minister Winston Churchill said that the war was over it tugged my heart knowing I will never see him again, but a wash of relief came over me because after years and years I am now safe once again. Up and down the country millions of people are out in the streets and uniting together to celebrate the end of the European conflict with street parties, dancing, singing and hosting dinner parties ubiquitous. But despite the joy and celebration, it is a day of mixed emotions for some like me who are mourning loved ones lost during the war, and for those who remain worried about friends and family.


