## Character Development – Autumn Term Update

Since the start of the term, pupils in Year 7 and Year 8 have been engaging in thought-provoking and creative activities as part of their Character Development curriculum. This learning journey ties in closely with our school values of Respect, Ambition, and Opportunity, helping pupils grow both personally and academically.

#### Year 7

Year 7 have made a strong start to the year by focusing on 'Getting to Know Each Other', laying the foundations for positive relationships and respectful communication within their tutor groups.

We then moved on to explore 'What is Character?', where pupils reflected on what it means to be a person of good character and how our actions reflect our values. This naturally led into our current topic on 'Virtues', where pupils have been introduced to key virtues such as kindness, honesty, perseverance, and courage. They've enjoyed thinking about which virtues they already demonstrate and how they can continue to grow as individuals. Next week, pupils will be combining creativity and character as they design their very own 'Virtue Superheroes'—inventing characters who embody the virtues they have learned about and imagining how they would use these traits to help others and make a positive difference. We will then be moving on to learning about our Community.

#### Year 8

Year 8 have been developing their critical thinking skills through a unit on 'News & Media Literacy'. They have explored what news is, the different ways we consume it today—such as newspapers, TV, online platforms, and social media—and why it is important to stay informed.

A major focus has been on Fake News—how to spot it, why it spreads, and how to evaluate the reliability of sources. Pupils have shown great engagement in discussing the impacts of misinformation and disinformation in today's digital world.

To conclude the topic, we'll be turning the classroom into a mini newsroom! Working in groups, pupils will be challenged to create their own news stories—some real, some fake—and present them to the class. This interactive activity will test their creativity and understanding of the key ideas we have explored, as well as sharpen their skills in distinguishing fact from fiction.



Coming Up – Film Screening (week beginning 6<sup>th</sup> October 2025)

As part of their Character Development learning, both Year 7 and Year 8 will be watching the 2017 film Wonder (PG). The movie follows a boy with facial differences as he attends a mainstream school, navigating challenges of friendship, bullying, and acceptance. The film explores powerful themes of kindness, empathy, overcoming prejudice, and celebrating difference, supporting the values we aim to promote in our school community. #### Year 10 Update

Thank you to all our parents who attended the Year 10 Information Evening at the start of term. I hope you found the evening both informative and useful in supporting your child through their GCSE journey.

At the meeting, we highlighted how important it is for pupils to start building their CV in preparation for sixth form applications next year. Taking on responsibilities in school is a great way of demonstrating our school values of Ambition and Opportunity. These roles help pupils to develop key skills, show commitment, and stand out when applying for future positions.

# HELPING YEAR 9 BUILD HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS

As part of our Year 9 PSHE and Relationships & Sex Education (RSE) programme, pupils recently took part in 'Trust Me', a lively and thought-provoking workshop delivered by the Loudmouth Educational Theatre Group. The session used an engaging drama about a young couple starting out in their relationship to spark conversations on real-life issues. Pupils explored how good communication, understanding consent, and knowing about contraception and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) all play a part in having safe, happy and healthy relationships. They also learned about the importance of regular testing and how to access local sexual health services.

After the performance, students joined guided discussions where they could ask questions in a safe space and think about how to make positive, informed choices.

Workshops like 'Trust Me' are designed to complement the lessons your child receives in school and help them feel more confident about navigating relationships as they grow. You might find it helpful to ask your child what they learned or found surprising from the session. These open conversations at home can really reinforce the messages and support them in making responsible decisions.









# TALK TALK WORKSHOP

Pupils enjoyed a half day workshop to find their voice and explore the skills of public speaking. They learnt how to communicate confidently with others, stepping outside their comfort zone to engage with their audience.

Speaking in front of others is an essential skill for young people, but can often be a daunting experience, especially for our youngest pupils in the Senior school. It was a delight to watch them speaking to the whole year group without their notes, having fun and gaining confidence.

At the end of the workshop, Oracy Champions were announced for each year group - those pupils who had shown impressive skills or had made the greatest progress throughout the day: well done to Maya and Tegh in Year 8 and Rumaysah in Year 7!
