Art and Self-Expression

The children explored the art of self-portraiture. Using mirrors, they carefully observed their facial features and practiced following step-by-step instructions. We were impressed by how focused and thoughtful they were during the activity. Each child's unique personality shone through in their artwork, helping to build confidence, attention to detail, and self-expression.

Child-Initiated Play

Red Group children have been deeply engaged in child-initiated play, confidently exploring a variety of activities that spark curiosity and imagination. Some enjoyed water play, experimenting with pouring, filling, and measuring. Others were drawn to Halloween-inspired activities, making delicious pumpkin pie. Creative expression flourished at the art table, with children freely exploring painting using a range of colours and materials. These self-directed experiences allowed the children to lead their own learning, develop independence, and build essential skills across different areas of development.







Our Prep pupils have been busy producing some fantastic artwork this term, exploring a wide range of themes and techniques.

Our Year 6 pupils took a big step forward with their first taste of life in Year 7! 🙌


