#### **EXPLORING SENSES**

This week, our curious 2-year-olds have been diving into a variety of sensory experiences — from squishy cold custard and smooth chocolate to slippery jelly, textured pumpkin, and magical potion-making with water, food colouring, glitter, and bubbly washing-up liquid!

These activities might look like messy fun — and they are! — but they also play a vital role in early learning and development.



#### Why is Sensory Play So Important?

Brain Development

Sensory play helps build strong brain connections, encouraging problem-solving, exploration, and early scientific thinking.

Communication & Language

Describing textures, colours, and sensations boosts vocabulary and confidence in expressing ideas.

Physical Development

Pouring, mixing, and squashing help strengthen fine motor skills, building the muscles needed for writing and self-care tasks.

Social & Emotional Growth

Working together to make potions or explore materials supports turn-taking, cooperation, and emotional regulation. Sensory play can also be soothing and help children manage big feelings.

Creativity & Imagination

From pretending to be wizards making potions to cooking up jelly treats, sensory play fuels imagination and creative expression.

Understanding the World

Children observe how things feel, smell, move, and change — a hands-on way to learn about the world around them!








### Prep

### PHONICS AND READING WORKSHOP

On Tuesday morning parents of Year 1 were invited to take part in a phonics workshop with their children. This was an opportunity to learn about the teaching of phonics in lower prep and to talk about the importance of reading.

#### **YEAR 7 AND 8 LIFE SKILLS**

In Life Skills this week, Year 7 and 8 pupils have been learning valuable practical skills, including how to safely change a fuse in a plug. They also explored the importance of electrical safety and how to use household appliances responsibly.









### GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK WEEK

Over the last week Year 7 have been introduced to the concept of Geography investigations. They have enthusiastically been conducting surveys and analysing the gathered results.

The first enquiry was "Is there more traffic on the street where I live than in front of school?" This involved counting the different types of traffic passing both places for a period of 15 minutes. The results were varied, with some living on much busier roads than Broadway North and others only having one vehicle passing their house during the survey time.

The second investigation was conducted in the Arboretum and involved finding out whether the facilities there were aimed at local people or tourists. Both classes enjoyed their walk around the Arboretum noting the facilities on offer and discussing who they were aimed at. It turned out that although most of the facilities could be used by tourists and locals alike, that the Arboretum is mainly for the use of the local community.

It was an enjoyable week of lessons where the pupils threw themselves into this new element of learning outside the classroom and investigating the world they live in.


#### **PHYSICS TRIP**




We talked about the strategies we use in school, as well as how to create a reading culture at home and we engaged in a short shared reading activity between parents and their children.

Active readers develop these good habits:

- Skimming the text to gain an overview of the topic. Can you summarise what you have learned at the end of each page?
- Scanning the text, looking for specific information.
- 3. Read with a ruler supports fluency.
- Circle or underline unfamiliar vocabulary then check meanings in a dictionary!
- 5. Pay attention to the punctuation as you read.

### **Working Together for Success**

#### **FORMER PUPIL INSPIRES YEAR 11**

We were delighted to welcome back former Year 11 pupil Malikah, who returned to speak with our current Year 11s about how she prepared for her GCSEs and achieved outstanding results — performing on average two grades above her baseline.

Malikah's success was the result of her determination and the strong support she received from her teachers, academic clinics, and the flexible timetable and pastoral guidance provided by the Head of Year, Deputy Head, and SENDCo.

We are incredibly proud of her achievements and the positive example she continues to set.

During her talk, Malikah shared practical revision tips that helped her succeed:

For Maths: video walkthroughs, Corbett 5-a-day, past paper questions, Hannah Kettle Maths, GCSE Maths Tutor, and Maths Genie.

For Science: online flashcards such as Gizmo, Cognito, Free Science Lessons, Physics and Maths Tutor, and First Class Maths.

She also recommended MyEdSpace sessions the night before exams for English, Maths, and Science.





### Working Together for Success FORMER PUPIL INSPIRES YEAR 11

Malikah spoke about effective study habits, including blurting and retrieval practice, making her own flashcards with questions and answers, and teaching someone else to reinforce understanding. She emphasised staying organised with physical folders for past papers and an online folder for knowledge organisers.

Her key messages to our Year 11s were simple but powerful:

- Believe in yourself and keep a positive mindset.
- Make time to relax she found the gym helped her unwind.
- Prioritise sleep and use calming strategies to manage stress.
- During October half term, she studied around four hours a day, and after mock exams, she maintained a steady routine of one hour of homework and one hour of revision, always finishing by 9pm.

Malikah's visit was inspiring and timely as our current Year 11s prepare for their mock examinations after half term. We are so proud of her journey and grateful that she took the time to share her experience and advice.

The Girls winner was Hawa in 20minutes 44seconds.


The house competition is calculated by the average points score per pupil. Which means that the current standings, after round 1 are:


