

RECEPTION ADVENTURES: FROM COMPUTERS TO CREATURES!

This half-term in ICT, our Reception class has been exploring the exciting world of computers! Pupils have begun using the school laptops, learning to name and identify different parts of a computer, and developing their fine-motor skills through engaging maths games — using the trackpad to move icons across the screen with growing confidence.

Our topic, 'Animals', has also taken us on a global adventure. We started by learning about creatures living in the icy North and South Poles, before journeying to the warm African Savannah. Each child selected an animal from these regions to paint, resulting in some truly impressive artwork.

In Mathematics, the children have been focusing on numbers 1 to 5. They have been practising number order, exploring one more and one less, and learning how to compose 3, 4, and 5 through a combination of adult-guided activities and child-initiated play.

It has been a wonderful half-term filled with curiosity, creativity, and joyful learning!

DIGITAL DIETS: HELPING TEENS THRIVE ONLINE AND OFFLINE

Screens are everywhere—learning, chatting, gaming, streaming—but too much time online can affect sleep, focus, and wellbeing. This month, we're exploring how small, simple routines at home can help children aged 11–16 build a healthy digital diet.

Why it matters?

Just like food, digital content can nourish, neutralize, or drain. Teens often don't notice when apps or screen time start to impact mood, sleep, or stress. Parents can guide balance through conversation and shared routines. Quick tips for a healthier digital routine:

Set screen-time goals together Instead of strict rules, agree on family guidelines:

- Daily screen limits on school nights
- Extra flexibility at weekends
- Clear boundaries for homework vs. leisure

Create tech-free zones

Switch off in key spaces:

- Dining table for family meals
- Bedrooms after bedtime
- Quiet reading or homework corners

Protect sleep

- Set a "digital sunset" to put devices away
- Charge phones outside bedrooms
- Encourage calming offline activities before bed

Talk about their apps

Ask curious, non-judgmental questions:

- "What do you like about this game/app?"
- "Who do you chat with here?"
- "How does it make you feel?"

Lead by example

Kids notice adult habits. Put your phone down during meals, show balanced tech use, and conversations will naturally follow.

Add offline micro-moments

Small screen breaks make a difference:

- Short walks
- Cooking or board games
- Reading side-by-side




